Social Realities in Latin America

An Integrated Approach to Regional Culture and Development Studies

January 9 to February 22, 2025

"Social Realities in Latin America" is an academic program meant to sharpen the students' awareness of the main development concerns and social challenges in the region. The key factors of the program are an appealing balance of academic and social activities, full cultural immersion, and direct contact with experts, NGOs and the local population.



Elements of the program

Spanish Language Course

Placement in different groups according to each student's level.

40 hrs

Visit to NGOs:

- Weekly thematic visits to NGOs.
- Integration activities with the community.

5 days

Service Learning Workshop
(taught in English)

- Basic methodology of social projects: Analysis of macro- and micro-environment; planning, implementation and assessment.
- Meetings & discussions with experts.

30 hrs

Excursions

- Leisure activities and weekend trips to touristic must-see sites.

Thematic Lectures
(taught in English)

- Relevant theoretical and conceptual background for the program.
- 1 topic per week (week 1 to 5).

40 hrs

Study Trip

- Visit to cultural and natural highlights in one of the country's most impressive regions (Cuetzalan).
- Approach to indigenous communities and their way of living.

1 week

- Topics:
- Human Rights
 - Poverty and Social Inequality
 - Indigenous Studies
 - Migration
 - Environment and Sustainability

About 'IBERO'

Universidad Iberoamericana is considered one of Mexico's most prestigious universities, distinguished by its high academic standards and strong social commitment. The Mexico City campus is located within the Santa Fe business district (western part of town).



Curricular value and credits

The academic contents of the program are configured at undergraduate level. The overall workload comprises 165 hours of activities (lectures, workshops, supervised visits to NGOs, etc.), plus individual study time. The credit value of the course corresponds to 7.5 semester credit hours (U.S.) or 15 ECTS (European system).

General requirements

- Legal age at the moment the application is submitted.
- Formally enrolled at an accredited university, with good academic standing.
- Having completed 1 full year or more of university studies at the beginning of the program.
- Fluent English language skills. Basic Spanish language

Fees

- Application fee (non-refundable): \$65 USD
- Program fee: \$4,770 USD

Program includes

- An advance payment of 50% of the program fee is required by: October 16, 2024
